- Please review the school's dress code in the parent/student handbook or on-line **before** purchasing back-to-school clothing. Modesty is our standard! Thank you!
- Locker shelves are strongly recommended for all students in grades 6-12. They are the best way to help students keep books, notebooks, and other items organized. We recommend using **two metal, stackable shelves** (found at Target and Office Supply stores). They tend to hold up well and can be used for a number of years. The office has a few extra. First come, first served. Please ask if there is a need.
- **Planners** - Students in 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup> & 9<sup>th</sup> grade will be receiving a school-issued planner to assist them in keeping track of assignments, projects and test dates. 10<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> graders are encouraged to purchase a planner to their liking.
- All AP students need a personal e-mail account.
- All high school students need to have access to a computer with word processing software such as MicroSoft Works or Word. (Please let us know if you do not have access to a computer at your home and we will try to get one for you.)
- Flash drives are recommended for secondary students. This will allow them to save documents being worked on at home and at school. **Students are responsible for printing papers at home.** The school does not provide printing of student papers.
- Please mark **all** clothing, lunch boxes and personal items with your student's name. Please make sure names are written inside each text book once it is received. This will help cut down on lost and found items. All books & notebooks are to be kept in lockers or in back packs throughout the day.
- Office supply donations of Expo dry erase markers & board cleaner, sticki-tac, tissues, & wipes are welcome.
- Please note that there may be a few changes to the supply list once the school year begins.

**MS Math (1 and 2)** Compass, protractor (clear, may be tinted)

**Algebra 1** Calculator (a good, inexpensive calculator is the TI-30XIIS) (square root and exponents)  
**Please note future calculator needs if purchasing a new one. \*Cell phone, I Phones, and other PDA types are not permissible as a calculator.**

**Algebra 2** Calculator – (TI 83 Plus is recommended)  
**Geometry** Protractor and compass, calculator that does sin, cos, and tan (TI-83 Plus is recommended)  
**Pre-Calculus & Calculus** Graphing Calculator (TI-83 Plus is recommended)

**SCIENCES**  
All Science Courses 2" binder, 5 dividers, loose-leaf paper (on 1<sup>st</sup> day of class)  
Pencils

**Physical Science** A compass, protractor and 12 inch. ruler, graph paper and calculator  
**Chemistry & Physics** Calculator, graph paper and Lab goggles (optional, but recommended)

**REMINDER OF ELECTRONICS USE POLICY:**

- **Students are NOT allowed to use electronics during the school day** (except calculators for math only, not for playing games). Electronics include any type of mp3 player, radio, handheld video games, blackberry, etc.\* These items should not be brought to school. Students are allowed to have a cell phone at school as long as it is kept off and out of sight throughout the school day. Students are allowed to go to the office to use their cell phone to make important phone calls. If any of these items are seen, teachers will send the item to the office for pick up by the student at the end of the school day. Repeated offenses will require a parent to come in and pick up the item. Please communicate this policy to your child BEFORE school starts.
- \*Laptops are allowed, but only for school-related work.
