Dear Dayspring Community and Families

As we enter into a new calendar year and gear up for the second semester of this school year, I am humbled and blessed by the continued faithfulness of our small but growing community. As we continue into a season and year of growth at Dayspring, amidst the blessings and challenges of this growth, I continue to be amazed by your children and the incredible ways they reveal and evidence our Lord and Savior on a daily basis. What a special time, place, and community in which God has blessed us all to participate. Thank you.

This year is a challenging one on the financial front for DCA. The increased expenses of a dual campus scenario (rent, van purchase and maintenance etc.) as well as the current national economic climate have worked together to create some unique challenges. On this front, there are three major points that need to be communicated to all of families/community.

First, our fundraising goal for 2008-2009, like the last few years is \$100,000. And we currently find ourselves right at the halfway point of the year having raised approximately \$30,000. This means we still need about \$70,000 to finish this school year.

Second, unlike past years, there is a rather high percentage of past due fees and tuition, undoubtedly due to the difficult economic climate of these uncertain times. This is becoming a point of some concern.

Third, a great blessing on the financial front is also unfolding. The Fall Power Serve raised about \$20,000 after expenses. These funds are intended for capital purchases. \$9,000 of this money was spent on our new school van. The rest we are setting aside for future purchases along with other donations of this type (donations designated for future capital purchases). The seeds of our future growth are being sown right now. What a great blessing.

So it is to these three opportunities that this letter is intended. It is important that our fundraising for the year gets on pace for the rest of this school year. Look for more information about our Annual Fund soon. It is also important that we try to stay on schedule or get back on schedule as soon as possible with tuition and fees payments, and that we communicate candidly with the school office about these situations. This is also a season when we are asking you to be prayerful about the possibility of contributing to our "Capital Campaign" for the future of DCA.

Bottom line, we have very real, current, and ongoing financial needs that we need your help to meet. We have future needs as well. Please be prayerful as to what you might be able to do in continuing to help out the school community.

UPCOMING EVENTS

- **Help us CAN THE VAN!** – The Student Leaders (Class Officers, SCA, and student organizations) at Dayspring are combining efforts to sponsor another “Can the Van” food drive. Last year we exceeded our goal and collected 1800 cans of food. This year our goal is to collect 2000. The students and staff at Dayspring are being challenged, as they are able, to bring in 10 cans of non-perishable food (soup, vegetables, fruit, etc.). Drop off dates will be February 2 through the 13th. Just bring your cans to your first period class (not the gym like last year).
