## Helping Their School by Helping Others

(Written for a press release)

When the bell rang to start the school day on November 7<sup>th</sup>, 2008, the students at Dayspring Christian Academy in Blacksburg, VA didn't even hear it. Nearly every one of the school's 200 students was gathered in the school gym. They milled in groups, with teachers, parents, school staff and volunteers dotting the crowd of excited kids. They would have the day off from school, but no one in the gym was going to spend the day at home, relaxing. Instead, they would be raising funds for Dayspring in the school's first ever Serve-a-thon.

Students, staff and parents at the school had spent the months since August sending out letters to friends and family, as well as local businesses, asking for sponsorships for 3 or 4 hours of community service on November 7<sup>th</sup>. On that day, the entire student body, along with parents and school staff, blanketed Blacksburg and Christiansburg in a "PowerServe."

Students participated in a number of ways, including visiting residents at a local nursing home, collecting food at Food Lion and Kroger for the local food pantries, doing yard work at the homes of the elderly and homebound, preparing and cooking lunch for the Salvation Army's "God's Lunchbox" program, and helping organize materials and clean the attic at the Caring Pregnancy Center.

That afternoon, the students and volunteers enjoyed an afternoon cookout and celebration, along with an "auction" of gift items provided by the business sponsors of the fundraiser. A number of local businesses had provided gift certificates, coupons, and other items for the students.

For the volunteers, the success of the day was measured not in funds raised for Dayspring, but in raising the students' awareness of the many different ways to lend a helping hand and be an encouragement to others.

## **ATHLETICS AT DAYSPRING**

### **Dayspring Boy's Soccer Wins NACA Division II Championship**

In John Denver's song Poems, Prayers, and Promises, he reflects on his life and how good it has been. I have been reflecting lately on the boy's varsity soccer season and how glad I am that I shared in their experience as a team. Before the NACA Championship game on October 31st, I told the boys that every time I strap on my cleats to warm them up for a game, I remember my high school soccer days. I also told them how proud I am to be associated with the Dayspring soccer program.

There is great value in athletic competition. Spiritual lessons are learned in the course of a season. If athletic competition did not have value for spiritual development, Paul would not have written in his first letter to the Corinthians: "Do you not know that those who run in a race all run, but only one receives the prize? Run in such a way that you may win. Everyone who competes in the games exercises self-control in all things. They then do it to receive a perishable wreath, but we an imperishable. Therefore I run in such a way, as not without aim; I box in such a way, as not beating the air; but I discipline my body and make it my slave, so that, after I have preached to others, I myself will not be disqualified." (I Corinthians 9:24-27). If Dayspring kids learn physical discipline, they will learn spiritual discipline as well. That is my goal for them as their soccer coach.

For me, the NACA tournament was about developing relationships. It was neat to win a Championship, but it was really cool to get to know your boys better. I even had some time to meet players and coaches from other teams. One morning, I joined some boys from the Mountain Mission team in Grundy, VA. I enjoyed the time we had while we ate breakfast. They were neat kids.

Here are a few of my recollections from our time with the Dayspring boys at Fort Bluff Camp. I will never forget the lack of heat in our bunkhouse the night we arrived. I thought I had arrived in a concentration camp, with bunks stacked 3 high in the room, each one nicely numbered so we wouldn't lose the guy in bunk 132!! I certainly won't forget seeing McKeever Henley wrapped up in his coat that night because he forgot to bring a sleeping bag. He was fortunate that the heat was turned on the next day and that my wife had extra blankets in the car for him. I keep a picture of McKeever in my cell phone to remind me. I won't forget going to bed with Andrew Vu and Zach Brown peering out from their bunks across from me and above me, sitting cross-legged. They didn't say much, but they were glad to be there. I have great memories of the boys playing soccer and basketball on the courts outside our bunkhouse. It was good to see them enjoying being together. On the last night we stayed at Fort Bluff Camp, the boys had free time to enjoy watching other soccer and the girl's volleyball teams play (they seemed drawn more to the latter). My instructions to the group were to be in the room by 11:15PM. Some of the guys were hanging out

with me in the room by 10:30PM. The last of them walked into the room at 11:14PM!! A coach cannot ask for better compliance. Thanks for raising boys who respond to our leadership!!

I have much to be thankful for after my first season with these boys. I am thankful that Tommy Cousins is such a great coach. I learned new things from him in the course of the season, but I will never match his capacity for quick decisions. I did learn to throw my hat well by watching him, though. We all owe a debt to Tommy for his capable coaching and team organization during the past several years. Tommy, you left me some big shoes to fill. Given the great winning seasons of the past 3 years, I really have my task cut out for me as we rebuild the soccer team over the next couple of years!!

Here is my report on the details of the NACA tournament. It was a great run!!

During the week of October 26<sup>th</sup>, Dayspring traveled to the NACA tournament to play against 8 teams in the Division I and II bracket from Virginia, North Carolina, Florida, and Ohio. Head coach Tommy Cousins and assistant coach John Copeland knew the Dayspring boys showed up to play when they played to a 1-1 tie against the Hearts for Jesus home schoolers, a select team from Cleveland, OH in the opening match on the morning of October 29<sup>th</sup>. That afternoon, the Dayspring boys dropped into Division II after a tough 3-0 loss in the second match of the tournament to Seffner Christian School from Tampa, FL.

Dayspring opened their Division II play on October 30<sup>th</sup> with a match against the team that defeated them in the VACA State Championship, Shenandoah Valley Christian Academy, prevailing against them 2-1 in a hard-fought contest. In the Division II semifinals on October 30<sup>th</sup>, the Dayspring boys handled the Roanoke Valley Christian School team in a 3-1 win. On October 31<sup>st</sup>, Dayspring capped their excellent season by defeating Shenandoah Valley Christian Academy 2-1 in the NACA Division II Championship. In addition to bringing home the Championship trophy and banner, the Dayspring boys were awarded the Team Sportsmanship trophy for the Division II bracket. Dayspring captured most of the Division II tournament honors, with Stephen Copeland, David Cousins, Daniel Henderson, and Russell Kroeger named to the All-Tournament team. Copeland, Cousins, and Kroeger captured the Division II individual awards, by winning the Offensive MVP, All-Tournament MVP, Defensive MVP, respectively.

This year's team was led by a devoted group of senior captains, including forward Stephen Copeland, center midfielder David Cousins, utility man Daniel Henderson, and sweeper Russell Kroeger. This senior captain squad was supported by a solid group of senior starters, including outside midfielder Daniel Armstrong, marking back McKeever Henley, and forward Adam Koelling. Three junior starters contributed to Dayspring's winning season, including center midfielder Caleb Bryant, goalkeeper/outside midfielder Dillon Mayhew, and marking back Chris Reighard. The starting team was rounded out by freshman stopper Samuel Copeland (a home school student). Valuable contributors this season were junior forward Zach Brown, sophomore forward Michael Pfohl, freshmen goalkeeper/outside midfielder Spencer Miller and outside midfielder Zack Cousins, and eighth grade forward Eli Hairfield (a home school student), Other team members included sophomores Chris Shelor and Andrew Vu and freshman David Henderson. Freshman Jack McDonald played marking back early in the season, then spent most of the season with eighth grade home schooler Wyatt Fagan on the injured reserve list.
